YOUR AGENCY IS INVITED TO PARTNER WITH US!

Your agency is invited to partner with Continuing Nursing Education at the University of Washington School of Nursing (UWCNE) in offering the Wound Management Fundamentals Course (WMFC). Content is based on national wound management guidelines for a broad range of wounds. Upon completion, participants earn 30.0 contact hours. The completion rate over the past three years has averaged 98%.

THIS COURSE IS PRESENTED IN TWO PARTS:

- Six weeks of online learning which establishes a baseline level of knowledge for each participant.
- Two days of onsite learning which provides hands-on, skills training.

DISTANCE LEARNING FORMAT

This course is transmitted online to groups of nurses and other members of the healthcare team at participating sites. Organizations may choose to hold the two-day workshop (the onsite component) **synchronously** with live transmission from Seattle or **asynchronously** on days chosen by the agency.

AGENCY COORDINATORS AND AGENCY INSTRUCTORS

Each organization designates a qualified candidate as the Agency Coordinator (AC). ACs are typically nurse educators who promote registration, monitor participation and create a positive learning environment. Agency Instructors (AI) are certified wound care professionals (CWCN or CWS) who mentor participants throughout the course and provide hands-on instruction during the workshop.

CO-SPONSORSHIP FEES

The co-sponsorship fee for each organization is \$3500 per course offering, which includes tuition for 1 to 10 registrants.**

- Tuition per person for each additional registrant over 10 is \$350.
- Tuition for primary AC and AI is fee-exempt.
