For registered nurses and other health professionals involved in the care of persons with nervous system dysfunction in a variety of clinical settings.

CONFERENCE DESCRIPTION

This annual conference provides an update on new developments, evidence-based practice and the art of neuroscience nursing practice. This year's topics, presented by regional and national experts, include concussion and use of helmets, controversies in the care of TBI patients, an update on anticoagulants and reversal agents, neuromuscular disorder case studies, pituitary dysfunction, updates on seizure guidelines and interventions for stroke. Teaching methods include lecture, discussion and case study analysis.

OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of the conference, participants will be better able to:

1. Discuss how helmet technology can reduce the incidence of concussions in sports.
2. Apply state of the science evidence to care of the severe TBI patient.
3. Discuss the mechanisms of action and indications for usage of direct oral anticoagulants (DOACs).
4. Describe the anatomy of the peripheral nervous system (PNS) and how to use simple patterns to localize neuro lesions.
5. Articulate the impact of pituitary dysfunction following brain insult on hormone regulation, symptoms and outcomes.
6. Identify 3 changes in the seizure classification system.
7. Summarize Interventional Neuroradiology for acute ischemic stroke, including indications, techniques, benefits, potential adverse effects, and peri-procedural care.
